

Regulations for the Establishment of the International PhD Program in Taiwan and Transcultural Studies

1. These regulations for the establishment of the International PhD Program in Taiwan and Transcultural Studies (hereinafter “the Program”) comply with the National Chung Hsing University (NCHU) organizational charter.
2. The Program aims to empower students with knowledge on Taiwan’s humanities, a global vision, and capabilities for international academic exchange.
3. A program director shall be appointed to manage the Program’s affairs. The directorship can be assumed by the dean of the College of Liberal Arts or by a full-time faculty member with the rank of associate professor or higher at the dean’s recommendation. Thereafter, the director shall be appointed by the president of NCHU.
4. The Program Affairs Committee, set up by the Program, shall make decisions on affairs pertaining to the Program. The committee shall consist of between five and nine members, recommended and selected by the director from among the faculty members with a rank of assistant professor or higher. The committee shall include one student representative. The director shall serve as the committee chairperson. The term of office for all committee members is 1 year, which can be extended.
5. The Curriculum Committee and the Hiring Committee, also established by the Program, are responsible for the following tasks: a. The Curriculum Committee reviews the Program’s curricular planning and course offerings and determines the number of years of study, graduation requirements, and other related matters. b. The Hiring Committee manages the Program’s hiring process, including recruitment examinations and other related matters. The organizing regulations for the aforementioned two committees are to be established separately.
6. Any matters beyond the scope of the Program’s established regulations shall be dealt with in accordance with the relevant regulations set by NCHU.
7. The regulations herein, after being established by the Program Preparatory Committee, shall be submitted to the college and thereafter announced and implemented. Any modifications to the regulations must first be approved by the Program Affairs Committee and then submitted to the college. Subsequently, they shall be made public and implemented.
